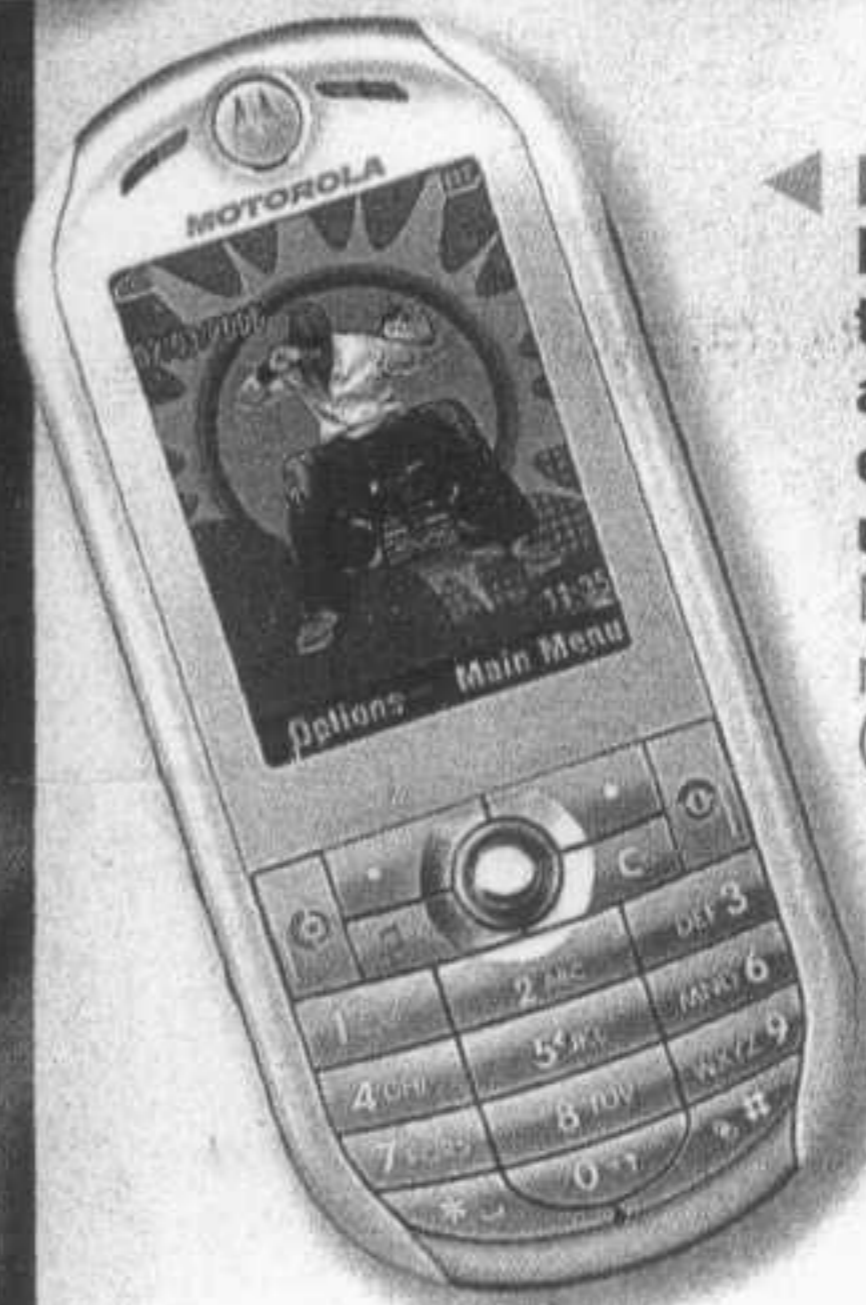

TIPS What every new cell should have



John Biggs, news editor of gadget Web site Gizmodo.com, gives the 411 on essential features for new mobiles:

- **A DECENT CAMERA:** Get at least 1 or 2 megapixels. If the phone has a VGA camera (the lowest quality available) pass on it.
- **E-MAIL:** On the go a lot? Consider a phone with e-mail capabilities. The prices are getting more and more competitive!
- **WEB SURFING:** Phones with Internet access are the wave of the future. Each provider has a different monthly fee for this service.

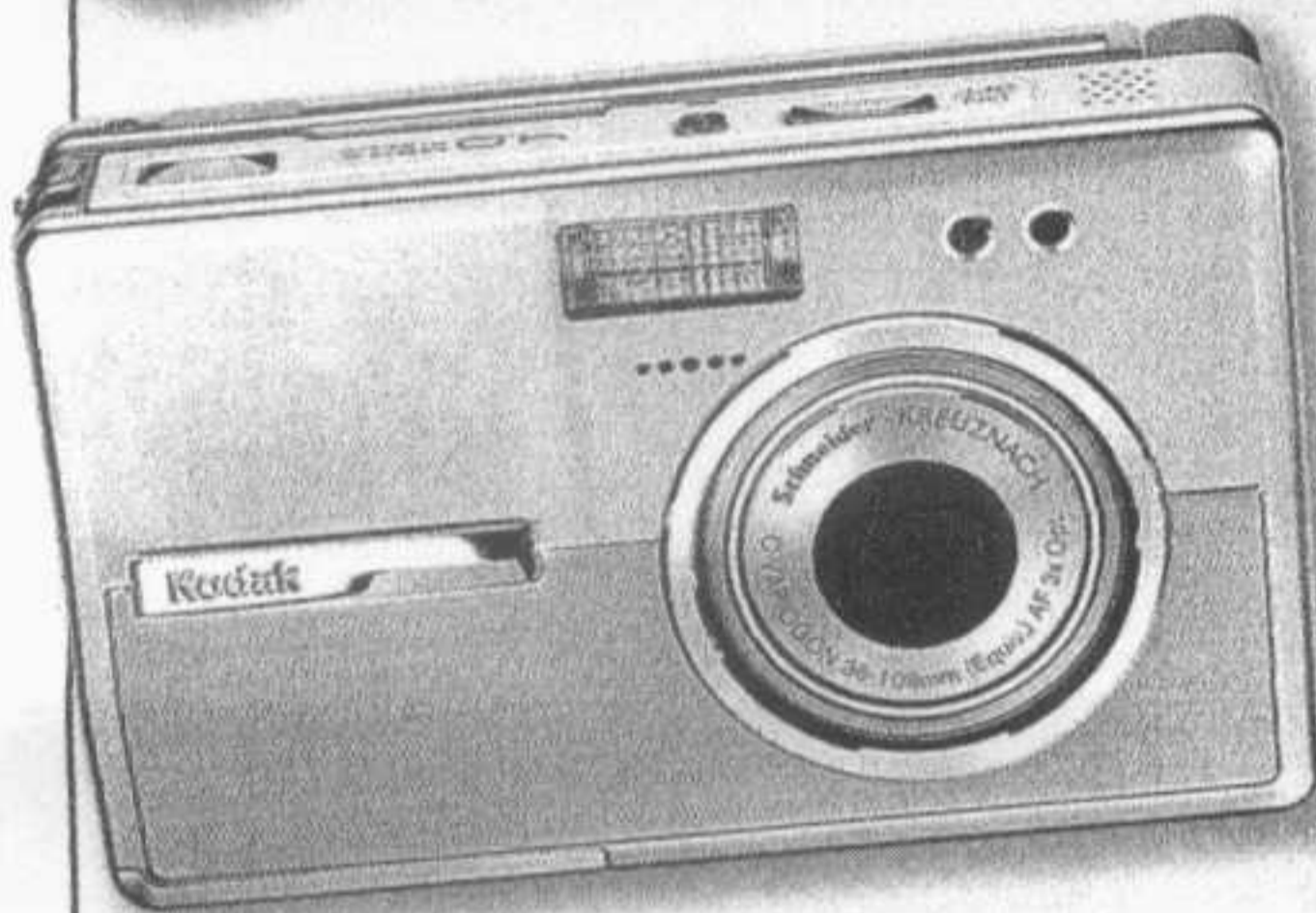
CHARGE ON THE GO

▲ SNAP AND SEND

INSTA-PRINTS
Talk about instant gratification! In 80 seconds, you've got a real picture. Just insert the memory card into this easy-to-use personal photo lab, press print and — voilà!

Camera-speak made easy

MEGAPIXEL Indicates what the photo quality will be: The more megapixels, the better the picture. Experts recommend a camera with at least 3 or 4 megapixels — any more than 5 megapixels is almost pro quality.

MEMORY This is the number of pictures that can be stored on a reusable card in the camera at one time. Look for a card with at least 64 megabytes of memory — enough to store about 350 pictures.

LCD SCREEN Allows users to preview photos as soon as they're taken. Unappealing shots can be deleted instantly.

OPTICAL ZOOM Magnifies the subject to get shots that appear close-up. Avoid cameras with digital or electronic zoom, a gimmicky feature that makes a subject look closer but doesn't improve resolution, leading to fuzzy pics. If you mainly take group shots of people, you'll need less zoom (1x or 4x); if you're taking faraway shots, you'll need more (10x or 12x).
